## **Meet Gary and Lori Lewis**

ary and Lori Lewis are primarily known in the Church of God for their prominence in the ministry of youth and discipleship, having served in multiple states and regions as youth leaders and Gary's eight years as assistant and director of youth ministries for the Church of God from 2008-2016. Before being elected as secretary general two years ago, they served as administrative bishop in South Georgia for six years.

Gary and Lori met while attending East Coast Bible College in Charlotte, North Carolina, a school operated by the Church of God until it closed a few years ago. Gary came from his hometown of Bethalto, Illinois, where he attended the Bethalto Church of God after being miraculously saved in a revival at 13. While Gary is first generation Church of God, Lori's heritage in the Church stretches four generations.

East Coast was closer to home for Lori and she transferred there after earning an associate's degree. Married following graduation, the Lewises are approaching 40 years together in ministry partnership.


Their ministry began right out of college in 1987, where they followed a well-worn path as youth leaders and small church pastors. Their

first ministry interview was with the Louden Ave. (now Man-o-War) Church of God in Lexington, Kentucky.

"They wanted someone to lead the youth and music, so they got two for the price of one," Lori stated referring to her role as music minister in the church. "After six months the church began paying us two salaries, which was kind of unheard of back then. They (the pastors) just loved us, nurtured, and mentored

#### Council Passes Seven Motions on Thursday By David White

he International General Council passed seven motions during Thursday's business session at the 79th International General Assembly.

The first to pass was on the discussion floor for three business sessions over two days, and concluded with the body fine tuning and approving a motion that strengthens its stance on Biblical sexuality.

The finalized motion reads:

"That all Church of God leaders, ministers, teachers, and employees—defined as credentialed employees, or any employees connected with conveying the message of the church and carrying out its mission—not be employed by or regularly attend churches or religious organizations who hold stances on human sexuality contrary to biblical teaching, the Church of God Minutes, the Declaration of Faith, or the Practical Commitments of the Church of God, subject to appropriate polity action."

Further, that appropriate Church of God departments curate biblical sex education resources designed principally and practically for use in Church of God regions, churches, and educational institutions.

If the motion carries through the General Assembly vote on Friday, it will further ensure that those representing the Church of God at all levels will adhere to Church of God polity, practices and teachings concerning human sexuality.

It will also help provide churches the resources needed to provide Biblical teachings on human sexuality in a culture that often runs contrary to Scripture.

In other business:

- The General Council approved a motion that allows Administrative Bishops to appoint ordained female ministers to serve on ecclesiastical trial boards when they deem it appropriate.
- The General Council adopted an item titled "Generational Harvest," which affirmed the Church of God's belief in the Great Commission as a divine command and a mission point for all believers.
- The General Council also approved motions in regards to doctrinal fidelity of ministers and Church of God educators, among others; lowered the pastoral experience minimum from five years to four years to become a state overseer.

Debate on the remainder of the agenda continues through Friday morning. The General Assembly of the Church of God is set to convene at 1:30 pm in the main hall. ◆

A special treat was hearing seven-year-old, Daisy Lindsey, share about being called to preach at Alabama Youth Camp this year and then deliver a sermonette on David and Goliath. The event ended with a time of prayer led by Rev. Sandra Kay Williams.



### Ministerial Internship Program Birthed in Hawai'i 50 Years Ago

(Editor's Note: The Church of God celebrated 50 years of the Ministerial Internship Program at the MIP Commissioning May 17-18, 2024. The following is an adaptation of the history of MIP published in the Church of God Evangel)

In 1973, three couples, and a single man were commissioned into a year-long pilot program of intense training designed to culminate with a launching into formal ministry. The ceremony took place on June 17, 1973, during the Church of God Camp Meeting in the mission state of Hawai'i. The interns then spent a year in assignments and were formally commissioned the following summer.

The new ministry training program was based on scripture from Acts 6:3-7 where the disciples chose seven men of good report and appointed them as assistants . . . "and when they had prayed, they laid their hands on them. And the word of God increased, and the number of disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly (KJV)." The purpose of the program—initially referred to as the Christian Internship Program—was fourfold: (1) Provide Christian laborers, (2) Give specialized training, (3) Stir personal commitment, and (4) Require scriptural submission.

The seven individuals were young people in their early 20s, most of whom were new Christians having been radically saved from lives of degradation and drug use. Dennis Duguay found salvation during a Bible study conducted in a cave. Mark and Yvonne Knock were former members of the Navy who, after hitchhiking across country, ended up on the island of Kauai in the same Bible study. Carl and Terry Oliver shared a similar experience, having dropped out of the establishment way of life to join the "Hippie" movement. A third couple, Wilfred and Jaye Tabian, were native Hawaiians who demonstrated their total commitment to Christ through their participation in the new training program.

"This was the period of the Jesus Revolution," Mark Knock, an atheist at the time, stated. "In almost every car we entered while hitchhiking, we were witnessed to about the love of Christ. After we got saved, we were camping in a tent on Kauai and the Lord convicted us that we needed to get married. (Church of God) Pastor Jack Powell married and discipled us, and we were soon introduced to this new program for young believers eager to launch into ministry."

Dennis Duguay was also saved under Jack Powell's ministry.

"Living off the land on Kauai at the time, he (Powell) picked up me and a friend hitchhiking," Dennis related. "He invited us to a Bible study in a cave, which I thought was so cool." Duguay and the Knocks got acquainted and together they joined the internship program along with the others bringing that first group to seven—coincidentally or prophetically—reflecting Acts 6.

The fledgling initiative consisted of a preparation period of approximately six months which involved reading 25 books (including a systematic reading of the entire Bible), attendance to study classes on a variety of topics, and participating in field assignments. During that June 17, 1973, service, the interns were commissioned into their one-year assignments with the laying-on-of-hands by pastors and church leaders, a tradition that has carried on to this day, most recently at the May 18, 2024, MIP Commissioning ceremony. That initial group was labeled, "a vanguard of a mighty army that God is raising up to evangelize these islands and all of the South Pacific."

Leading this new training program was the Church of God state overseer of Hawai'i at the time, Robert E. Fisher. The young 42-year-old church leader mentored and discipled the seven, continuing to develop the program until completion of their assignments in 1974. By then, "Dr." Fisher had completed his dissertation and been awarded a Ph.D. from the University of Hawai'i.

Dr. Fisher credited much of the early success of the Christian Internship Program in Hawai'i to the financial assistance of the Mount Paran Church of God in Atlanta and then-pastor, Dr. Paul L. Walker.


"Dr. Walker ministered in Hawai'i recently and saw the need and the potential of the work here," Dr. Fisher stated at the time. "His response and that of Mount Paran resulted in the sponsorship of this pioneer effort."

An update on the Christian Internship Program was detailed in the February 1974 edition of the Church of God publication, Aloha State News (See previous page). The article reported, "After six months of intensive academic, physical, and spiritual training, the interns were commissioned and given assignments in various areas of church work. From the beginning, a spirit of great anointing rested upon the participants, and upon their ministries." The article went on to report that the Knocks were serving at a downtown Honolulu center where Mark was director of outreach programs and Yvonne was a children's Bible teacher. Dennis Duguay was assigned to the Waialua Church of God as Christian education director. The Tabians were at a new church plant in the town of Waipahu serving in various roles. And the Olivers were pastoring the Kalaheo Church of God on the island of Kauai. Statistics of the internship program were reported in that same issue and included 65 persons saved, 638 visits made, 2,501 pieces of literature distributed, and 4,079 witnessing visits made.

In perhaps a prophetic statement, the article concluded by saying, "This initial attempt at an internship program in the Church of God has been highly successful. It is hoped that it will lead to an even greater emphasis on training of young people in the Pacific area and eventually to a general denominational internship program for ministerial candidates."

Recognizing the Kingdom potential for such a program, Fisher was appointed by the Executive Committee as director of Church of God General Education at the 1976 General Assembly in Dallas. One of his first goals was to adapt the Hawai'i model to launch today's Ministerial Internship Program (MIP) in 1978-79. In the decades that have followed, the lives of thousands of young ministers and their families around the globe have been transformed by a program that began with seven people on islands in the middle of the Pacific.

Fifty years later Fisher's explanation for the purpose of the program still applies today: "These are crucial days that demand an unusual commitment and consecration. The Lord again challenges His people, 'Whom shall I send? . . . Who will go for us? . . . Who will answer—Here am I, Lord, send me!"



A Tradition Continued – Launching of interns through the laying-on-of-hands by their leaders has been a tradition since Hawai'i. The class of 2023 interns were prayed into ministry at the annual MIP Commissioning Service on May 20, 2023, in Cleveland, Tenn.

At the 2024 MIP Commissioning this past May, the Division of Education announced the inauguration of a scholarship/advancement fund to benefit future MIP interns. The fund will honor the legacy and contribution of Dr. Fisher as the founder of MIP. ◆



us and treated us like their grandchildren. I really credit them for giving us a great start in ministry."

After two years Gary followed his calling to be a pastor and they accepted a church in remote Fairbanks, Alaska. Most of the members were military and while the Lewises were impressed by their integrity and work ethic, enlarging a congregation was difficult as so many were deployed time and again. They counted Fairbanks as a growing and maturing experience.



After two years they accepted a church in the Great Lakes Region with a troubled past and a string a short-term pastors.

"The first question the clerk asked us when we walked in the door was, 'You're not going to leave, are you?" Lori said. "As young pastors we had a lot of personality and financial issues and other dynamics to deal with at the church. But we also saw miraculous things.

God proved to us that if you serve Him and be obedient, God will take care of you."

In 1994 the Lewises received a call from T. David Sustar inquiring if they would consider an appointment as state youth directors. Accepting the challenge, they began their journey in the Midlands Region, living in Iowa. From there they migrated to the Pacific Northwest in 1996, and then to Eastern North Carolina for four years. Their final two assignments as state youth directors were in South Georgia and South Carolina before Gary was elected to the Youth and Discipleship Department. Over a period of 14 years, the Lewises crisscrossed the country five times. Both Gary and Lori cherish this period of transitions as a time to be mentored and learn leadership from the multiple overseers they worked under.

Outside of ministry, for fitness Gary has enjoyed the challenges of running and biking. He has run 89 marathons over the years, and Lori has joined him on close to 30 half marathons

Three years ago, Gary was training for an event, riding his bicycle on a back country South Georgia road, when he was struck by a hit and run driver. His back was broken in three places, he suffered a punctured lung, broken ribs, and a lacerated liver. The hit was so powerful it cracked his helmet.

"Through that journey was the healing on the other side of it," Gary explained. "The x-ray Gary Lewis in training for one of his many athletic events

showed white where my back had been broken and new bone had grown in. As traumatic as the accident was, it required no surgeries, medications, treatments...nothing!"

Both will be quick to point out that family is most important. They have three grown children: two sons, Jordan and Jaren, and daughter, Sara. They also have two grandchildren, Elijah and Eden Lewis.

When asked about his plans and vision for the Church of God as its new leader, Dr. Lewis said, "The vision is really going to be reaching the Harvest, the theme of this Assembly...We are going to continue to focus on evangelism, discipleship, preaching the word, care, compassion, and prayer empowered by the Holy Spirit."

In closing the new general overseer said, "From a spiritual standpoint my commitment is to be found faithful. I'm a steward, not an owner and am thankful that God has entrusted me to be a steward of our Church." ◆

#### Concilio de los Dieciocho

l Concilio General ha elegido a tres nuevos miembros del Concilio de los Dieciocho. Este grupo de obispos ordenados formará, junto con los cinco miembros del Comité Ejecutivo, el Consejo Ejecutivo Internacional.

Los 18 miembros actuales del Concilio de los Dieciocho fueron elegidos en 2022 y podían ser reelegidos para un segundo mandato de dos años. El Concilio, históricamente diverso, se mantuvo prácticamente intacto, aparte de la incorporación de tres nuevos miembros. Por lo tanto, los mandatos de quince de los dieciocho elegidos este año concluirán en 2026. Según las *Minutas* de la Iglesia de Dios, el Concilio

General debe incluir una representación específica de grupos de ministros, al menos doce pastores activos, tres que vivan fuera de los Estados Unidos y tres "en general". Al final de la tarde del martes, los miembros del Concilio General habían elegido a los diez primeros miembros, empezando por el ministro que recibió el mayor número de votos, el obispo Kevin McGlamery. En virtud de su elección, McGlamery, pastor de la Iglesia de Vida en Huntsville, Alabama, servirá como presidente. #### Reinstauración del Ministerio de Evangelización

l Concilio General Internacional aprobó una moción para restaurar la oficina del Ministerio de Evangelización y dos líderes electos, uniendo el Ministerio de Misiones en los Estados Unidos, plantación y revitalización de iglesias bajo un mismo departamento el miércoles en la 79ª Asamblea General Internacional.

Con la moción aprobada, el Concilio General nominó al Dr. Sean S. O'Neal para servir como director de Evangelización y al pastor Robert Scott Sheppard para servir como director asistente de Evangelización. El cuerpo también votó para restaurar la oficina del director de Evangelización estatal/regional. Los cargos electos de director y asistente fueron eliminados en 2010 en la Asamblea General Internacional de ese verano. La votación del miércoles enmendaría los estatutos de

las *Minutas* para permitir que el ministerio vuelva a estar bajo el liderazgo de sus líderes electos. Para el Dr. O'Neal, este próximo paso marca su jornada por un testimonio personal, la evangelización urbana y la plantación de iglesias. Después de su nominación, el Dr. O'Neal recordó cuando plantó su primera iglesia con su esposa Shyrel y su pequeño hijo Sean Michael en el centro de Chicago hace casi 30 años.

Sin saber diez palabras de español, los O'Neal plantaron una iglesia en español. El primer servicio incluyó a su familia de tres, un amigo que traducía y dirigía el culto, y una pareja católica soltera que respondió a los volantes de su vecindario y asistió a su primer servicio de las 3:00 p. m. "En un año teníamos más de 30 nuevos convertidos y esa iglesia todavía está allí hoy", dijo el Dr. O'Neal.

El Dr. O'Neal se ha desempeñado como obispo administrativo de la Iglesia de Dios de California/Nevada desde 2018 y desempeñó el mismo rol en Arizona antes de eso. Desempeñó un rol fundamental en el desarrollo de la Red de Plantación de Iglesias de la Iglesia de Dios y tiene una larga historia como misionero y pastor urbano y global.

El Pastor Scott Sheppard ha pastoreado la Iglesia Cornerstone en Athens, Georgia, y su congregación ha sido reconocida como una de las 100 iglesias de más rápido crecimiento del país por la revista *Outreach*. Fue reelegido para el Concilio de los Dieciocho el martes, pero dejó vacante su puesto una vez nominado para el puesto de director asistente. "Soy un hijo de la iglesia, nacido en la Iglesia de Dios, criado en la Iglesia de Dios, educado en la Iglesia de Dios, y amo mucho a esta iglesia", dijo Sheppard. "Creo en la evangelización, creo en la iglesia local". ◆

# **Church of God in Hawaii Continues Relief Efforts After Maui Fire**

August 17, 2023—Lahaina, HI—General Overseer Tim Hill and Secretary General Gary Lewis conducted a Zoom call on Wednesday, August 16, with Hawaii State Overseer Rob Taylor, who gave an update on the efforts of relief and recovery following last week's devastating fires on Maui. The International Christian Fellowship (ICF) Church of God in Lahaina was completely destroyed by the wildfires which has wiped out the town and left more than 100 dead as of Wednesday. Taylor reported that the outpouring of relief on the state has been overwhelming.

"Response by the Church of God family has been amazing," Taylor said. "We have been able to transport over 5.5 tons of supplies, including toiletries, diapers, food, and water. Goods have come from all the islands, and local air services shipped the initial supplies for free. This direct touch outreach has been a blessing to watch."

Taylor described how the home of Benny Mariano, pastor of the ICF Church, was miraculously spared from the fires, but they are now housing nine families. "Benny is a tremendous leader," Taylor said. "Two of their staff lost their homes and are now staying in Wailuku, much like the 12,000 residents of Lahaina who have dispersed across Maui and to the other islands. While hotels and shelters on Maui are full, these fires have affected all of Hawaii."

"We are standing with Pastor Benny, you, and the Church of God in Hawaii," said Hill. Lewis, who serves as the Covenant Team leader for Hawaii said, "This is going to be a journey, and we are going to continue to pray for God to receive the ultimate glory through it all."

Taylor ended the call sharing the heart of the Church of God going forward as three-fold: (1) Relief—the supplying of basic needs; (2) Recovery—determining the new normal for those affected by the disaster; and (3) Rebuild—looking for the best approach toward rebuilding the historic Lahaina church. ◆

#### Walker Resigns Lee Presidency; Conn Appointed

March 19, 2024—Cleveland, TN—Lee University president, Dr. Mark Walker, notified the school's Board of Directors that he will not seek a second four-year term and will conclude his presidency on May 5, 2024.

Walker announced his decision to the Lee faculty and staff in a meeting Monday afternoon on campus. "My wife Udella and I have enjoyed our four years in this role," he said, "but after lots of prayer and reflection, we are confident that our time as president is now complete."

May 5 is the date of Lee's spring commencement exercises, which will be Walker's final activity as president.

Board chairman, Wade Lombard, a Texas businessman, praised Walker's commitment to Lee during his four years as president and a prior term of three years as vice president for ministerial development. "We on the board have worked closely with Dr. Walker during these last four years, and all of us appreciate his hard work and dedication to our students and mission."

Prior to coming to Lee in 2017, the Walkers served for twenty-five years as senior pastors of Mount Paran North Church of God in Marietta, Georgia.

In accepting his desire not to seek a second term, members of the Lee Board of Directors expressed appreciation for his contributions at Lee. "He has the heart of a pastor," one said in Monday's meeting, "and that has certainly shown in his care for students and their love for him." Others noted the many challenges which the president faced during his term, which began in August 2020 at the height of the Covid crisis.

Lombard said the school is planning various events during April to celebrate the Walker presidential legacy and express appreciation for his accomplishments.

The Lee board also voted unanimously to ask Dr. Paul Conn, a long-time veteran of the Lee administration who was Walker's predecessor, to accept a one-year appointment as president and chancellor, to lead the school through this transition and begin the search for a new permanent president. Conn has accepted the appointment of the Lee University Board of Directors, to begin May 5. ◆
